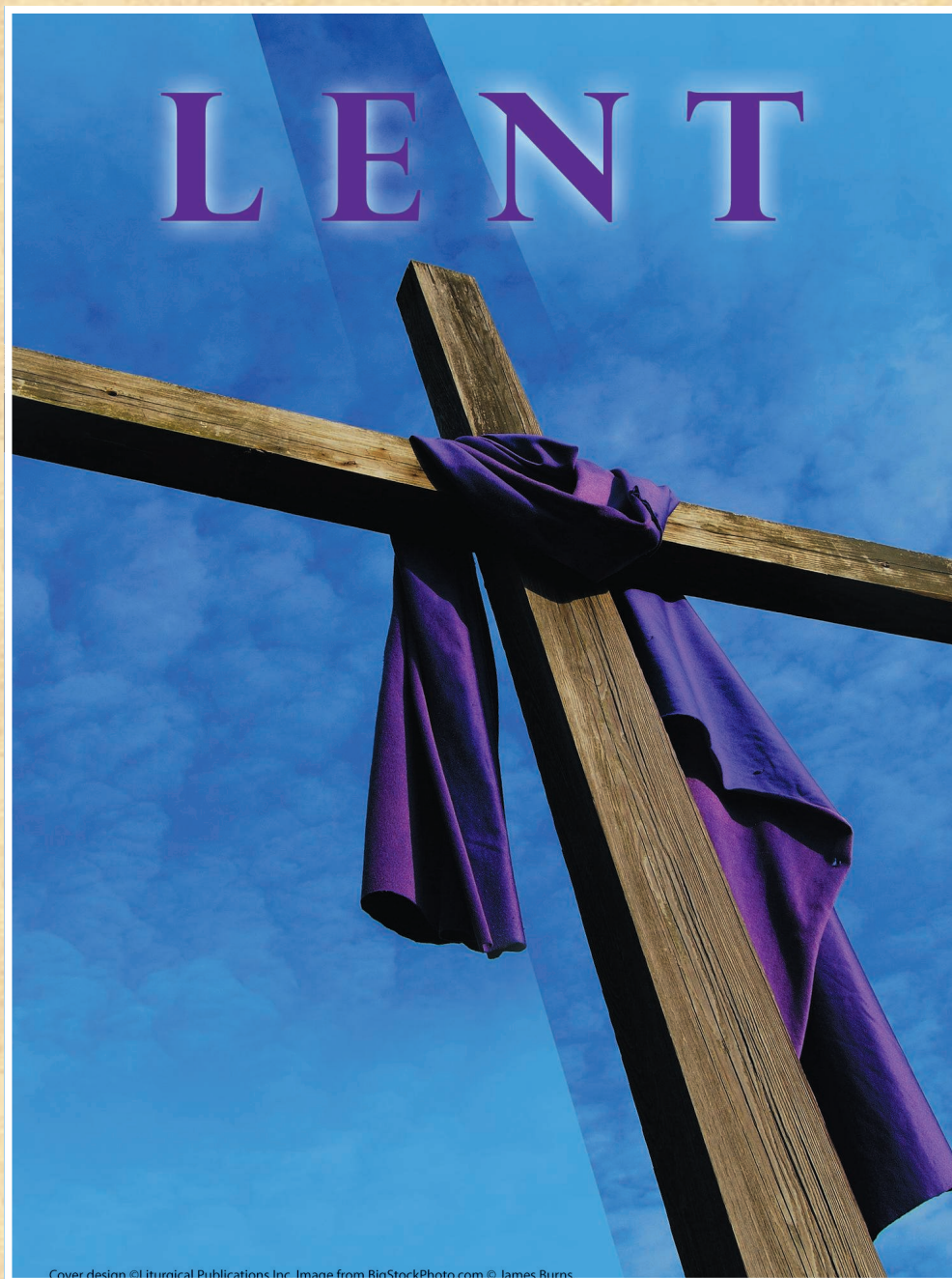

Lenten Regulations

Abstinence -- Catholics over 14 years of age are bound to the obligation of abstinence. Abstinence is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent. On days of abstinence, meat may not be used at all.

Fast -- Catholics over 18 and up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to the obligation of fasting. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are the days of fasting. On these days, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed.

Regarding other weekdays of Lent, participation in daily Mass and the voluntary observance of fasting is recommended.

MINISTRY MINUTES

Reflection ~ Robin Black-Rubenstein

On this last Sunday before Lent begins, the Gospel of Mark tells us the story of the leper who came to Jesus to be healed. Knowing he has been deemed an outcast, he comes to Jesus in his need. It took courage and audacity to come and ask Jesus for help. As we read, however, we know that he, "came to Jesus and kneeling down begged him..." the leper's approach to Jesus and Jesus' response to the leper reminds us of how Jesus wants to restore our dignity when we feel we are at our worst moments in life. Fr. Ronald Rohlheiser, author of, The Holy Longing, suggests that Jesus' own prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane can serve as a model for how we can pray when we're in crisis. He has highlighted seven elements in Jesus' prayer that resonate in the leper's request to Jesus in today's Gospel.

1. The prayer issues forth from his loneliness: In our deepest crises, we are always painfully alone, a stone's throw away from others. Deep prayer should issue from that place.
2. He begins the prayer by calling his father "Abba", the most familiar term possible. In our darkest hours, we must be most familiar with God.
3. The prayer is one of complete honesty: He asks God to take the suffering away, to give him escape. His humanity cringes before duty and he asks for escape. That's honest prayer.
4. The prayer is one of utter helplessness: He falls to the ground, prostrate, with no illusions about his own strength.
5. The prayer is one of openness, despite personal resistance: His prayer opens him to God's will, if that is what's ultimately being asked of him.
6. The prayer is one of repetition: He repeats the prayer several times, each time more earnestly, sweating blood, not just once, but several times over.
7. The prayer is one of transformation: Eventually an angel (divine strength) comes and fortifies him and he gives himself over to what he is being asked to undergo on the basis of a new strength that comes from beyond him. It is only after the desert has done its work on us that we are open to let God's strength flow into us.

The Last Public Homily of Pope Benedict XVI was on an Ash Wednesday

On Ash Wednesday, February 13, 2013, Pope Benedict celebrated his last public liturgy before his resignation from the papacy took effect. The readings that he drew his homily from are the same readings we will use when we observe Ash Wednesday in just three days. I have been studying his homily in preparation for Lent and I find what Pope Benedict said about the reading from the Prophet Joel a wonderful meditation in preparation for our own Lenten journey. Our Holy Father said –

"The readings that have been proclaimed (Joel 2:12-18) provide us with ideas that, with the grace of God, we are called to make concrete attitudes and behaviors during this Lent. The Church proposes to us, first the strong appeal that the prophet Joel addressed to the people of Israel, "thus says the Lord return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning," (2:12). Please note the phrase "with all my heart," which means from the center of our thoughts and feelings, from the roots of our decisions, choices and actions, with a gesture of total and radical freedom. But is this return to God possible? Yes, because there is a force that does not reside in our hearts but that emanates from the power of God. It is the power of his mercy." The prophet says, further: "Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, rich in faithful love, ready to repent of evil" (v13). The return to the Lord is possible as a 'grace' because it is the work of God and the fruit of that faith that we place in his mercy."

As I read what Pope Benedict said, it is influencing what I will choose to do for those three important Lenten practices of additional prayer, fasting and abstinence, and alms giving. My Lenten theme will be "return to me with all your heart" and the Lenten practices I choose will support that theme. When you come to receive ashes next Wednesday come ready to set out on the rest of your Lenten journey by having thought out what will make that journey special for you.

This helps to defray the cost of the scholarships that St Boniface gives out to the children of parishioners who qualify for a financial need-based scholarship.

The confusion is caused because the money that comes in the green envelopes goes into a special account that is used to pay the tuition for these children to attend Father McGivney Catholic High School, the money is not sent to Father McGivney for pledges toward the building of the new high school. There have been several parishioners who gave money in the green envelopes not realizing it did not go toward their pledge.
