## PASTORAL COUNCIL

### INTRODUCTIONS

Our new members, Kathy Hankins and Melinda Nosser, introduced themselves. Welcome!

### FALL SERIES OF FAITH STUDIES

Clyde introduced a three tiered plan—apologetics series, Bible study series, and book study/Christmas study series. He had several suggestions for each series. He is especially hoping to promote Pope Benedict's, Infancy Narrative as one of the book studies. He talked about creating small groups—some could meet on weekends—as well as promoting this to existing study groups.

Kathy suggested having on-line groups. She also said it would be helpful to have a place on our website where we would list small groups and what they are currently discussing. This way people could go out and find a good fit for what they are looking for and when they can attend. Father Rob suggested looking into Flocknotes which is an on-line platform that connects parish groups. There is a subscription fee. The group was reminded that all are welcome to attend the weekly RCIA classes. The topics and presenters are published weekly in the bulletin.

Georgann reminded the group that meeting space is limited with all the activities we already have. Kathy suggested meeting in parishioners' homes—maybe create a list of those willing to have small groups in their homes. Linda said that is the basic intention of our Last Supper Clubs (LSC), and that information—groups, topics, guidelines—are on our website. Lacey tried to find LSC on our parish website, and said it's a cumbersome process. Our current LSC series is scheduled through October and still needs a topic and sources for November. The new series begins again in December. Clyde will search topics and media.

Marisa said that when Robin BR would find a program for the fall/lent series she would also order materials in Spanish. She and her husband, Marcelo, would present the sessions. She also suggested a series on Our Lady of Guadalupe.

## PASTORAL COUNCIL

### PERPETUAL ADORATION

During this discussion the Liturgical Committee joined our group.

There is definite interest in this ministry. Marisa stated that the Spanish community is very interested and that many already go to Mother of Perpetual Help (MPH) in Maryville to participate in their 24 hour adoration. It is well known among the area parishes that MPH has adoration and many attend, but there has been some recent issues scheduling attendance during the middle of the night. They are also having problems getting coordinators for all times of the day—especially at night.

Therefore the discussion turned to having a plan to shut it down in an emergency or for lack of adorers. Perhaps we should start small—less than 24 hours. We talked about approaching the Knights of Columbus to attend during the hours that are hard to fill. We would also open this up to area parishes. Father Rob suggested we start with the Jubilee Year as a trial run. There will be a period of catechesis and sign up. We'll see what the response is and judge by those numbers.

Our hour was coming close to the end so we went quickly through a few items left on the agenda.

### ADULT FAITH FORMATION

- **Contact with Diocese Office of Catechesis**—Initial done.
- **Organize Lenten Study for the Parish**—Clyde is still working on a couple of ideas.
- **Martha and Mary**—working on a communications book. They may do a Scott Hahn series next.
- **Monday Day Group**—Bishop Barron—the Mass.
- **Grief Support**—made contact and will provide support.
- **Funeral/Bereavement**—Linda Daniels mentioned that we need more greeters. Sometimes you may be asked to read or be a Minister of Holy Communion.
- **Parish Mission**—set in motion by Robin BR. Georgann stressed that we need to get things going on this event sooner than later. We are scheduled for January 19-23, 2019. An invitation to the parish community should be made to volunteer to help with committees for this event— leadership, hospitality, refreshments, communications, brochure, liturgy and music, transportation, childcare. The guide from the Redemptorists says to allow two months prior to the event for planning. That would be November and December—otherwise very busy months. That gives us August, September, October and possibly November to make solid plans. Clyde assured us that we would make this a priority at our next meeting.
- **Communications and AFF program**—this was on the agenda but not discussed.
- **Fiat**—Georgann reported that the group struggles. There is no real leadership. It doesn't seem that anyone wants to commit. There is a core group of 5 or 6 women who have been meeting weekly to bond. (I, for one, am no longer participating because of other commitments.)
- **Fraternus**—Jason reported that there are 7 or 8 men and 7 or 8 boys in their core group. They are planning a Saturday/Sunday retreat camp this weekend. They also need more boys to attend.
